Description

This 1803 Draped Large Cent features an obverse (heads) design showcasing Lady Liberty draped in a toga, facing rightward. The word "LIBERTY" arches above her head, and the date "1803" rests below. The reverse (tails) depicts a wreath encircling the denomination "ONE CENT," with the inscription "UNITED STATES OF AMERICA" surrounding it. Below the wreath, the fraction "1/100" signifies the coin's value relative to a dollar.

While many Draped Large Cents were circulated heavily, they hold historical significance as the foundation of American one-cent coinage. Owning an 1803 Draped Large Cent connects you to the very beginning of U.S. small cent production.
