LOT 8 - 1936 Cleveland Centennial Commemorative Half Dollar Coin Choice



Description

The 1936 Cleveland Centennial Commemorative Half Dollar, struck to honor the 100th anniversary of Cleveland's founding, boasts a mintage of just 50,000 pieces, making it a semi-key date within the commemorative series. Designed by the renowned sculptor and artist, John Sinnock, this coin features a striking depiction of the city's seal on the obverse and a representation of the city's founder, Moses Cleaveland, on the reverse. Its relative rarity is underscored by population reports from grading services, which show that only a small fraction of these coins have survived in high grades, with many examples exhibiting typical strike issues and surface wear. Collectors will appreciate the coin's historical significance, as it reflects both the artistic and civic pride of the era, while also serving as a tangible connection to Cleveland's rich heritage. The coin's luster and eye appeal can vary significantly, with well-preserved examples commanding a premium in the market. As a key component for those completing a commemorative series or focusing on regional issues, this 1936 Cleveland Centennial Half Dollar represents an important opportunity for serious numismatists to acquire a piece of American history.
